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BRWF’s top priority is the health and safety of our valued volunteers and community members. These guidelines help to ensure that BRWF and its volunteers can continue to conduct watershed restoration without compromising our community’s health and safety. In order to best fulfill and abide by Governor Steve Bullock’s [Stay at Home Directive](#), BRWF volunteers will read and sign both this guidelines document and BRWF’s typical Volunteer Service Agreement.

1. Medical Screening Check in

At any point in the past two weeks, have you exhibited any of the following symptoms:

If a volunteer checks ‘Yes’ for any item listed in Section 1 without a symptom explanation, it is strongly advised that the individual stay home and not partake in any volunteer activities.

2. Transportation to and from Project Site

The volunteers will drive separately or with individuals that they have been living with for at least 2 weeks prior to the date of the WET volunteer day.

3. Personal and Gear and Hygiene

Volunteers are recommended to bring and wear their own appropriate face masks that cover their nose and mouth. Volunteers are recommended to bring and wear their own protective gloves while conducting restoration work and handling tools. Volunteers are encouraged to bring their own hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol content and to sanitize their hands after touching any shared equipment. If the volunteer has any of the needed tools, the volunteer is encouraged to bring them to the necessary project for their own personal use.

Much of the work will not require a surplus of tools. The tools that are used will be disinfected using disinfectant wipes prior to distribution. Sharing tools will be discouraged. Instead, volunteers will be encouraged to continually use the same set of tools and not to swap out or hand a tool to another volunteer. Any shared tools will be disinfected before handing over to someone else.

4. Distancing

Physical distancing (>6ft) will be maintained as possible during WET volunteer days. Driving separately will help with distancing.
